Please note, you will not have scope to design the work or choose data collection methods as this is an existing provision which needs to use existing assets and maintain continuity with the current contract. The existing contract is due to expire at the end of March 2021 and we would require the new contract to begin as soon as possible thereafter. We anticipate the new contract will run for a minimum of 3 years with the option to extend, based on the future requirements of the Environment Agency, which are yet to be confirmed.
