Parents report that since the beginning of the pandemic these needs have heightened and increased. Services across the health, education and social care sector have at times been restricted to providing support to only those requiring urgent care and families report feeling isolated and vulnerable. Requests for support for conditions such as Autism and ADHD have increased and parents are reporting lack of confidence in mainstream schools to support children with special educational needs, which has resulted in an increase in requests for Education and Health Care Plan and Special School Placements.
