The assessment panel carried out assessments against the key criteria (detailed above) using information and evidence from a range of sources, as well as their own knowledge and experience of working with the provider. Each key criteria was scored using a pre-determined scoring table (out of 5) based on the level of confidence that the assessment gave the assessment panel, of the providers ability to address all elements of the key criterion in terms of undertaking and delivering the service.

The assessment score for Fresh Futures (NCC) gave a high level of confidence that the provider will be able to deliver the requirements of the contract.
