Crown Commercial Service (CCS) is developing a new long-term contracting solution for the provision of temporary workers to replace the current framework, RM3749 Public Sector Resourcing. The aim of this framework is to build a market leading commercial model to connect workers with public sector demand, enabling contracting authorities to engage the right resources, with the right skills, at the right price, through a range of delivery models. This will include sourcing temporary workers, engaging pre-identified nominated workers, delivering work through statements of work (SoW), and engaging workers via a Recruit-Train-Deploy (RTD) model. The framework may also include recruitment of permanent and fixed term staff, and/or workforce strategy advice. The lotting structure and commercial model for this framework will be determined as a result of the market and customer engagement. Bidders will be required to implement their solution in accordance with the RM6288 Framework Schedule, "Security Requirement and Plan", to meet Framework Agreement requirements.
