VII.2.1) Description of the modifications

The WMCA has recently secured some extra funding (on 5th October 2023) from the Natural Environment Research Council to support the climate adaptation work programme. Need for additional works, services or supplies by the original contractor/concessionaire.

Description of the economic or technical reasons and the inconvenience or duplication of cost preventing a change of contractor:

The Greener Together Citizens' Panel was set up to be a long-term programme of work to engage a representative group of citizens to feed into the WMCA's energy and environment work. The Panel was kicked off through funding awarded by the WMCA investment programme, but the plan was always to bring in additional funding to discuss particular topics as and when appropriate. The WMCA is currently developing its climate adaptation work, and the University of Birmingham was able to secure funding through the Natural Environment Research Council to support the Panel to do some citizen engagement on the plans.

WMCA needed the modification as result of receiving the unforeseen additional funding; the modification does not alter the overall nature of the original contract and the additional funding of £54,000 does not exceed 50% of the value of the original contract value of £149,610 (PCR Reg 72(1)(c)).
