4. Waste carrier registration (name, number and expiry date) if the bidder/subcontractor is intending to collect waste from any Council.

5. Where a bidder received a suspension of the above licences, registrations and permits (waste management licence, waste carrier registration etc.) issued in the past five years, the bidder must be able to demonstrate reasons, duration, recommendations, plans in place to

implement recommendations and any pending prosecutions of each occurrence of the suspension.

6. Where a bidder has been convicted of breaching environmental legislation, or had any notice served upon it, in the past three years by the environmental regulator or authority (including council). The bidder must be able to give details of the conviction or notice and

demonstrate comprehensive remedial actions or changes made as a result of conviction or notice served.
