Culturally sensitive and trauma-informed care: The support should be delivered in a manner that is respectful of the cultural and linguistic needs of asylum-seeking families.

Safe and welcoming environment: The support should be delivered in a safe and welcoming environment that is sensitive to the needs of asylum-seeking women.

Support for infant feeding: Women should have access to information and support related to breastfeeding, including the provision of breastfeeding-friendly facilities.

Cultural competency: Providers should have a good understanding of the cultural norms and practices of asylum-seeking women to provide effective support.
