Contracts Regulations 2015 (SI 2015 No 102) provide for aggrieved parties who have been harmed or are at risk of harm by a breach of the rules to take action in the High Court (England, Wales and Northern Ireland).

Any such action must be brought promptly (within 30 days beginning with the date when the economic operator first knew or ought to have known that grounds for such action had arisen).

Where the agreement has not been entered into the court may order the setting aside of the decision to enter into the agreement or order Kirklees to amend any document and may award damages.

Following the correct implementation of a 10 day standstill period and publication of appropriate notices the court may only award damages once the agreement has been entered into.

Resolution between the parties is encouraged. After 30 days, if the matter has not been resolved the matter can be referred to a Mediator through CEDR Solve. Litigation should not be commenced until the Mediation has ended, save for in emergencies.
