It is anticipated the funding will last for up to 5 years. However, total budget for the whole procurement is dependent on Scottish Government Funding and therefore is subject to change.

These Provider/s should offer joined up and holistic support to service users who will likely be in targeted groups more vulnerable to mental health difficulties or experiences resulting in distress, such as Family Adversity, Social Adversity, and Neuro-diversity.
