The aim of the Interpersonal Trauma Service is to improve the health, wellbeing and safety of people who have been exposed to trauma arising from sexual violence and abuse and/or domestic abuse.

The objectives are to:

- Embed an Interpersonal Trauma worker to work across a specified number of practices to offer support to both health professionals working in practices and identified people who have experienced of interpersonal trauma.
- Embed a service for people at risk of perpetrating abuse.
- Provide appropriate training to GP teams to enable identification, enquiry, and response.
- Provide adults whose health is being negatively impacted by interpersonal trauma with appropriate support
- Provide support to children affected by domestic abuse.
- Provide people who are using abusive behaviours with appropriate support and interventions.
- Facilitate rapid access to appropriate support following referral.
