The Community Priorities Programme is a pilot programme funded by the Public Health Department at Westminster City Council and delivered by the council's Communities Department with the initial aim of strengthening community resilience in the north of the borough, specifically in Queen's Park, Westbourne, Harrow Road and Church Street wards.

The programme funds a series of community-led initiatives whose specific priorities and criteria are set by the outcomes of meaningful resident research and engagement. This was carried out by locally-based community development officers from the council with a wide range of residents in spring 2021.
