Supplementary Substance Misuse Treatment and Recovery Grant

The Supplemental Substance Misuse Treatment and Recovery Grant (SSMTRG) is a national three-year funding grant in addition to the Public Health Grant. Year 1 of the funding was allocated to local authorities in 2022/23, with Year 2 for 2023/24 and Year 3 for 2024/25. The funding is to support the local delivery of the Government 10-year drugs strategy From Harm to Hope. It is anticipated this funding will continue to local authorities to ensure ongoing delivery of the national strategy; however, this will not be confirmed until the completion of the next spending review.

This service specification is backed by core Public Health grant funding and also the Supplementary Substance Misuse Treatment and Recovery Grant.

Any bids that exceed the budget cap annually and in total will be disqualified from the procurement process.
