Due to the complex nature of this contract volumes are difficult to estimate and therefore figures should be used as a guide but will not reflect the actual contract value.

The estimate figures shown within this notice are based on historical figures, with a slight uplift and also reflect an anticipated increase due to the pandemic and increase in dog ownership (see paragraph below).

Lot 1 - Hampshire up to £160,000 (£40k per annum)

Lot 2 - Thames Valley up to £1,200,000 (£300k per annum) - note this is split over two kennels.

Where the Contract has not been concluded, the Court may set aside the decision to award the Contract or order the Contracting Authority to amend any document and may award damages. If the Contract has been concluded, the Court may only award damages, or where the award procedures have not been followed correctly, declare the Contract to be ineffective.
