The service will deliver 39 self-contained units of accommodation for rough sleepers with High/Medium or Low support needs.

The continued provision of a rough sleeper service in Redbridge Council is integral to the Council's response to homelessness and protecting some of the most vulnerable people in

the community. It is intended that this redesigned Rough Sleeper Accommodation Project will provide continuity of support for rough sleepers with multiple and complex needs.
