II.2.4) Description of the procurement

NHS Frimley ICB ("the Commissioner") sought to commission provision to provide Children's Hospice Services.

The service includes a model of care where the Clinical Nurse Specialist Service (CNSs) will provide expert clinical care for children with life-limiting and life-threatening conditions specifically, assessment, symptom management and end-of-life care to improve the quality of care provided to children and their families. Children with life-limiting conditions have complex needs involving multiple care interventions by a range of professionals. CNSs will work across the system collaboratively with other colleagues and services to meet the needs of children and families and improve care for children.

Frimley ICB has followed PSR Direct Award C for the contract to which this notice relates.

The total expected value of the contract for the initial 3-year contract term is £745,785. The optional 2-year extension expected value of the contract is £497,190. Therefore, the full expected lifetime contract value (3 year + optional 2-year extension) is £1,242,975.

The contract period will commence on the 01 August 2025.
