o Recruit relevant stakeholders for co-production activities (both survivors and professionals).

o Provide ongoing trauma-informed wellbeing and engagement support to survivors.

o Facilitate inclusive spaces where all stakeholders are valued and can work together as equals.

Scope: Additional specialist trauma counselling capacity

The provider will build upon existing provision in the Avon and Somerset pathway to address specific barriers to support, expand the current service offer to include specialist trauma interventions and address accessibility issues.

o Address specific barriers to support or access needs for clients with multiple complex needs. This may include reimbursement of transport costs or interpreter provision.

o Expand current service offer to include specialist trauma interventions and processing such as Eye Movement Desensitisation and Reprocessing (EMDR) and Narrative Exposure Therapy (NET).

o Identify and address accessibility for communities currently under-represented in referral demographics (linked to the work of the co-production element).

o Waiting Well - enhance early intervention support for clients on waiting lists, with a particular focus on ensuring this support is equally accessible across all areas and service providers.

The services will be for people aged 18 and over.
