Where required by Utilities Contract Regulations 2016, Thames Water will incorporate a standstill period at the point information on the award of a contract is communicated to tenderers. That notification will provide full information on the award decision. The

standstill period, which will be for a minimum of 10 calendar days, provides time for unsuccessful tenderers to challenge the award decision before the contract is entered into. For the award of contracts below the threshold values for the Utilities Contract Regulations 2016, or for which the regulations do not otherwise apply, standstill notices may not be issued.

Thames Water will notify suppliers if their application is successful and, if not successful they will also be provided a summary of the reasons within 15 days of the decision. Unsuccessful bidders have 30 days from the receipt of that summary to challenge that decision.
