The contract will be for

- 2 years initial contract period with a possible 12 month extension period;

Optional extension will be at the discretion of the Contracting Authority and subject to satisfactory financial and contractual performance and available funding.

This procurement process will mirror that of the Open procedure as in compliance with the Public Contracts Regulations 2015 (as amended) in respect of Health Care Services under the Light Touch Regime, Regulations 74 - 76 and the National Health Service (Procurement, Patient Choice and Competition) (No. 2) Regulations 2013.

Under the Public Services (Social Value) Act 2012 Contracting Authorities must also consider:
