Integration, Collaboration, and Service Sustainability: This criterion highlights the critical role of integration and collaboration in enhancing service delivery.

Improving Access, Reducing Health Inequalities, and Facilitating Choice: This criterion underscores our commitment to promoting

equitable access to healthcare services. It emphasises the importance of addressing health inequalities and enhancing patient choice, ultimately leading to improved health outcomes

for all.

Social Value: Social Value remains a crucial consideration in our evaluation process. It recognises the potential impact of service

changes on the local healthcare workforce and their contributions to broader social, economic, and environmental improvements in the community
