## **VII.2) Information about modifications**

### **VII.2.1) Description of the modifications**

Nature and extent of the modifications (with indication of possible earlier changes to the contract):

The scale and impact of COVID was unforeseen and redirected procurement resources away to priority PPE areas. Given some of the technical requirements and specialist furniture items required by PSNI, interim quotations are not possible nor proportionate as substantive testing is required and all items must pass through Quality Assurance and be assessed by Occupational Health & Welfare on ergonomics, strength, stability and BS5459 standard. In addition any appointed contractor must have CTC Police level 2 vetting. PSNI are currently undertaking a complete review of their requirements to clearly scope out what they need to ensure a fair and transparent competition going forward.

Need for additional works, services or supplies by the original contractor/concessionaire.

Description of the economic or technical reasons and the inconvenience or duplication of cost preventing a change of contractor:
