Inpatient detox and stabilisation services are an important component of local plans to improve recovery outcomes in Leicester and deliver safe and effective services to the increasing numbers of individuals in treatment.

The Provider must deliver a safe and effective, dedicated inpatient treatment service, offering assessment, stabilisation and medically assisted withdrawal for eligible adults (18+) with substance misuse problems, who reside in the city of Leicester. The Provider will deliver the Service in close collaboration with Leicester's recovery orientated integrated substance misuse treatment system.

The Provider shall ensure that services are delivered in accordance with NICE guidelines and include assisted withdrawal, stabilisation or maintenance therapy and combined withdrawal and stabilisation within a framework of psycho-social, relapse prevention and harm reduction interventions. The Service will include 24 hour qualified staffing cover in a controlled therapeutic environment sourced by the Provider.
