Community Support activities can include participating in an activity which supports the people or communities in Dundee, including assisting in community clean ups or development projects. Note that at the agreement of both parties, a work experience placement can be delivered instead of an awareness raising outcome. Assistance to source an appropriate work experience opportunity would be provided by the Community Benefits Officer. Note that the Council is currently developing a Community Wish system which will become live during the delivery of this contract. This will aid contractors in identifying activities which can be delivered as part of their Community Benefit requirements.
