Norfolk County Council has been successful in securing EWCO funding for the creation of three woodland areas as part of the Wighenhall Woodland project and the wider 1 Million Trees for Norfolk project. The woodland will be planted in three areas across the village of Wighenhall St Germans, 5 miles Southwest of Kings Lynn in Norfolk.

Norfolk County Council wishes to commission a Principal Contractor for the creation of the Wighenhall Woodland in Wighenhall St Germans, Norfolk. The successful contractor will follow the requirements of Norfolk County Council's England Woodland Creation Offer (EWCO) and will supply, plant and maintain circa 40,000 trees as part of the woodland creation.

Please note the the estimated budget for the initial contract is £440,000 and for the extended period of 10 years is an additional £100,000.

Norfolk County Council has joined the government's Devolution Priority Programme.

under way.
