Birmingham and Solihull ICS (BSol ICB) has a registered population of over 1.6 million people supported in primary care by 176 GP Practices/Practice Groups across five localities in Birmingham and one in Solihull.

The key acute providers comprise:

- University Hospitals Birmingham NHS Foundation Trust
- Birmingham Womens and Childrens NHS Foundation Trust
- The Royal Orthopaedic NHS Foundation Trust
- Birmingham Community Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust
- Birmingham and Solihull Mental NHS Foundation Trust
- Sandwell and West Birmingham NHS Trust

In addition a range of multi-specialty independent sector providers operate under ICB contracts across the 6 localities.
