Collett Park Gateway - Tender FAQs

1. Insurance Requirements

1.1 Would a commitment to upgrade to $\mathfrak{L}5m$ insurances if appointed be acceptable at Stage 1?

No. The tender requires evidence of £5m Professional Indemnity, £5m Employers' Liability and £5m Public Liability insurance as part of the Stage One submission. Commitment to upgrade after appointment does not meet the requirement.

1.2 Is the £5m cover required for the lead consultant only, or for each consultant?

The published requirement sits within the **lead practice's Stage One submission**. Subconsultants must hold appropriate cover, but the **£5m requirement applies to the lead consultant**.

2. Financial Standing Requirements

2.1 Is a status enquiry letter from our bank sufficient?

Yes. A status enquiry letter is a standard form of **bank reference**, which satisfies the requirement for a "letter of reference from their bank".

2.2 Would a letter from our accountant be acceptable instead of a bank reference?

No. The specification is explicit: the lead practice **must** provide a **bank** reference.

3. Professional Indemnity (PI) Level

3.1 Given the project cost (<£1m), would the Council consider a reduced PI requirement?

No. The tender sets a £5m PI requirement for all Stage One submissions. This requirement remains unchanged.

4. Project Budget and Surveys

4.1 Does the £600-£800k budget include fees and contingencies?

Yes. The tender states that the project cost **includes fees and contingencies** (but excludes VAT).

4.2 Are surveys provided, or must they be procured within the project budget?

Surveys are **not provided**. The design team must **commission the site survey(s)**, and the cost sits **within the overall project budget**.

5. Team Composition and Participation

5.1 Can a consultant appear in more than one team for this tender?

Yes. The tender places **no restriction** on a consultant participating in multiple bids, provided each team meets all submission requirements.

5.2 Is a co-design approach acceptable?

Yes. Co-design aligns strongly with the tender's expectations for:

- stakeholder engagement,
- collaboration with councillors,
- communication with the public, and
- development of social value.

It is not only acceptable but positively aligned with the project ethos.
